Dear Parents/Carers

Happy New Year and welcome back to the new term. We hope you and your families have managed to have an enjoyable and restful holiday.

We are looking forward to lots of exciting learning and activities this term and will try to keep things as 'normal' as possible. However, 'Public Health Somerset' are suggesting we continue to follow 'Amber' guidance, so some restrictions will still apply and visits and visitors will be limited.

Attendance & Illness

Please help us to keep our school family as well and as safe as we can.

Children with any symptoms of illness including a cough, temperature or stomach upset must NOT be brought into school.

Please inform the school immediately if someone in your household has symptoms or tests positive for COVID-19.

Updated Government Guidance on Covid-19

Self-isolation periods

Since 22 December, the 10 day self-isolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 7 days in most circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason. Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. This also applies to children under 5, with LFD testing at parental or guardian discretion. If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to your education or childcare setting from day 7.

Daily testing for close contacts

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time. *(Children under 5 are not being advised to take part in daily testing of close contacts. If a child under 5 is a contact of a confirmed case, they are not required to self-isolate and should not start daily testing. If they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 they should limit their contact with anyone who is at higher risk of severe illness if infected with COVID-19, and arrange to take a PCR test as soon as possible. They can continue to attend an education or childcare setting while waiting for the PCR result. If the test is positive, they should follow the [stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed COVID-19 infection](#))*
