Literacy

As writers, we will be exploring how traditional tales are written as well as more modern texts (Oliver's Vegetables, Oliver's Fruit Salad, The Gingerbread Man, Knock Knock, Handa's Surprise, Funnybones). We will be learning stories through Talk for Writing and retelling and recreating in our own work. We will continue to develop cursive handwriting and weekly spelling challenges will begin in September. We will also be using our skills in writing during topic work creating our own non-fiction pieces.

As readers, we will be joining in with the repetitive phrases in our favourite traditional tales. We will continue to challenge ourselves as readers at home & at school. In Guided Reading we will be focusing on asking and answering questions about a text using our reading strategies. We will be broadening our vocabulary as a class with some fun games and our daily word.

Maths

As mathematicians we will be focusing on place value, and mastering all 4 operations. We will learn through work with concrete resources, creating pictorials to support our understanding and finally using what we have learnt for written methods. We will also be having daily arithmetic challenges to work on our instant recall of number bonds and times tables. We will also spend time learning about 2D and 3D shapes, naming and exploring their properties.

Science

We will be busy scientists this term! We will be exploring the wonders of our own bodies, researching our senses, skeletons and main body parts and learning ways to have a healthy body and mind. We will compare our own bodies to other animals—identifying, sorting and recognising similarities and differences. We will use our family trees to explore the concept of genetics and where we get our different features from. We will look at baby photos and talk about growth and change. Where have we come from? Where are we going?

We will further develop our understanding of what it takes to be a successful learner and explore the concept of Growth Mindset and how this approach can enable us all to achieve our potential.




EDUCATIONAL TRIPS/VISITORS
